# **HISTORY (HISTRY)**

### Courses

#### HISTRY 622 GREAT TRIALS IN HISTORY 3 Units

This course explores major themes in the history of Western European and to a lesser extent the United States' legal institutions and legal cultures from ancient Greece to modern times. It examines the social, political, legal, cultural and intellectual assumptions that shaped the great trials of the western historical tradition through intensive reading and discussion of both orginal historical evidence and modern interpretations.

## HISTRY 691 TRAVEL STUDY *Repeatable* 1-3 Units Variable topics. Faculty-led courses abroad.

#### HISTRY 696 SPECIAL STUDIES IN HISTORY Repeatable 1-3 Units

Variable topics. Group activity. Not offered regularly in the curriculum but offered on topics selected on the basis of timeliness, need, and interest, and generally in the format of regularly scheduled Catalog offerings.

#### HISTRY 790 WORKSHOP 1-6 Units

Variable topics. Group activity oriented presentations emphasizing hands on and participatory instructional techniques.

#### HISTRY 794 SEMINAR 1-3 Units

Variable topics. Group activity. An advanced course of study in a defined subject matter area emphasizing a small group in intense study with a faculty member.

#### HISTRY 796 SPECIAL STUDIES 1-3 Units

Variable topics. Group activity. Not offered regularly in the curriculum but offered on topics selected on the basis of timeliness, need, and interest, and generally in the format of regularly scheduled Catalog offerings.

#### HISTRY 798 INDIVIDUAL STUDIES Repeatable 1-3 Units

Study of a selected topic or topics under the direction of a faculty member.

#### HISTRY 799 THESIS RESEARCH Repeatable 1-6 Units

Students must complete a Thesis Proposal Form in the Graduate Studies Office before registering for this course.
