Overview

The department provides a full-time residential comprehensive academic and clinical education program for graduate students that culminate in the requisite Master's degree for practice as a state licensed and ASHA certified speech-language pathologist. Masters students have numerous opportunities to meet competencies across the lifespan and in both rural and urban settings.

The Master of Science (MS) education program in speech language pathology residential at the University of Wisconsin - Whitewater is accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, 2200 Research Boulevard, #310, Rockville, MD 20850, 800-498-2071 or 301-296-5700.

The graduate program is designed for completion in five semesters which includes one summer semester. Clinical performance and portfolio presentations are an integral aspect of determining academic and clinical competence and must be successfully completed for the degree.

An undergraduate degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders is not a prerequisite for admission. However, students must successfully complete requisite pre-graduate course work. Students who cannot provide official transcripts documenting the completion of the prerequisites may not be enrolled in the graduate program.
